The jpegs will be viewed anonymously (that is, without revealing the photographer) and graded by the selection committee. (Committee members will not grade their own submissions, if any.) The best photographs, as determined by the committee's average grades, will be included in the exhibition. Only CPA members may participate in this exhibition.

As always, we want to have an impressive presentation. Exhibitors should plan to present work that is framed and matted or otherwise presented carefully. Because we have limited space, we discourage pieces wider than 28 inches. In some cases we may ask exhibitors to present their photographs in a smaller size than originally planned. We would like to include as many photographs as possible without crowding them.

Name, Email Address, Phone Number, Title of Each Photograph, Price of Each Photograph (or NFS), jpeg Files of Each Photograph. The jpeg should be created from a file ready for printing; the exhibited print must match the jpeg file submitted, same Frame Size (Width and Height).

You may submit either one or two photographs for this show. John will catalog the entries, but will not be on the selection committee. Scott will chair the selection committee which will not have access to the catalog of entries.

CPA HISTORY by Jack Leavell

DID YOU KNOW?

At the Edges of the Day was an exhibition of photography by four photographers: Patrick Bartley and Heath Clayton of Cary Photographic Artists, Andrew Kelly of Duleek Photo Group and Andrew Ellis of Navan Camera Club in County Meath, Ireland. The exhibition was presented by the Town of Cary, the Cary Sister Cities and Cary Photographic Artists.

After a competition of CPA members, Bartley and Clayton were selected to represent Cary in a cultural arts exchange and traveled to County Meath in mid-year 2008. They spent six days interacting with the people and making their photographs. Ellis and Kelly traveled to Cary in October when the fall colors were spectacular and the landscape was covered with pumpkins and political signs. (Excerpt from the Cary News, March 4, 2009).

The exhibition opened at the Page-Walker Arts & History Center on February 17, 2009 and an artists reception was held on March 17. It is estimated that 250 people attended the reception which featured music by Bill Leslie, refreshments and an opportunity to meet the Cary photographers. After the exhibition closed on March 24 the exhibition traveled to Navan, County Meath where it was shown for five weeks at the Solstice Arts Center.

The exhibition explored the people, places, economy and culture of Sister Cities Cary and County Meath as seen through the eyes of the four photographers. Both communities have undergone tremendous population and

economic growth. The photographers illustrated this change in the people, land and culture. Each of the four photographers had ten images included in the exhibition. The term At the Edges of the Day is drawn from what photographers commonly call the best lighting to capture a subject.

All four photographers commented in the exhibition brochure that the travel to photograph another culture was an exciting and rewarding experience. They used the phrases: “wonderful welcome”, “generosity of the people”, “the people were most enjoyable” and “the local people left the happiest and most endearing impression” to describe their experiences.
